# USDA RESPONDS TO THE NATION'S MOST DESTRUCTIVE ANIMAL DISEASES

#### **CHALLENGE**

An outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza ("avian flu") in 2014 put the \$40 billion US poultry industry at risk. The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) took the lead in responding to this threat to US food security. But as the outbreak spread, USDA found itself in need of experienced emergency responders to combat a virulent and fast-moving disease.

#### **SOLUTION**

Witt O'Brien's teamed with USDA to lead on-site command and control efforts. Our team grew to 43 staff, working shoulder-to-shoulder with USDA leadership to manage depopulation efforts and outbreak management across federal, state, local and private sector stakeholders.
